GENERAL SERVICES

Customer Care and Crisis Call Center

Ages: All

The Customer Care and Crisis Call Center assists individuals in locating and obtaining needed behavioral health services, by selecting resources most appropriate for their needs. All initial appointments are set through the Customer Care staff. Additionally, the team serves as a resource for the public through provision of information regarding behavioral health services.

Locations: Middle Tennessee Region

Mobile Crisis (24 / 7 / 365)

Ages: 18 and older

Mobile Crisis assists individuals and families experiencing psychiatric crises, and enables them to successfully resolve the crisis in a safe and comfortable manner.

Locations: Bedford, Cheatham, Coffee, Dickson, Franklin, Giles, Hickman, Houston, Humphreys, Lawrence, Lewis, Lincoln, Marshall, Maury, Montgomery, Moore, Perry, Robertson, Stewart and Wayne Counties

Walk-In Crisis

Ages: All

Centerstone outpatient clinics and partnership locations provide walk-in crisis services during normal business hours to assist individuals and families experiencing a mental health crisis. Gateway Medical Center and Maury Regional Medical Center can accommodate patients 24/7/365.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinics, Centennial Pediatrics, Columbia Pediatrics, Maury Regional Medical Center and Gateway Medical Center

Outpatient Counseling Services

Ages: All

Professional staff members provide individual, family, couples and group counseling and therapy services including, but not limited to: depression, stress, anxiety, divorce, anger management, grief, etc.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinics

Psychiatric Services

Ages: All

Psychiatric services are provided for individuals requiring medical interventions. An individual may be referred for medical assessment to determine if the treatment efforts might be augmented by the provision of medical treatment.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinic locations

PROGRAMS & SPECIALIZED SERVICES

Alcohol and Drug Treatment

Substance Abuse Treatment

Ages: 13 and older

Substance Abuse Treatment is provided for individuals who have a chemical dependency problem who need counseling and support.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinics

Adolescent Alcohol & Drug Program

Ages: 13-18

This grant funded program is for adolescents who have a chemical dependency problem and require more frequent and intensive therapy, or those with a chemical dependency problem coupled with emotional/behavioral problems. Centerstone staff members provide comprehensive alcohol and drug assessments.

Location: Coffee County

Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment

Ages: 18 and older

Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment is a grant funded program for individuals who have both a substance use disorder and a mental illness. This program provides therapy, intensive outpatient counseling, case management and psychiatric services for both disorders, rapid HIV testing for individuals and their partners, limited assistance with transportation to treatment and referral to primary care when needed. Individuals with co-occurring disorders have a better chance of recovery from both disorders when they receive services that combine mental health and substance abuse treatment.

Locations: Cheatham, Dickson, Davidson, Montgomery, Robertson, Rutherford, Sumner, Williamson and Wilson Counties

Intervention Services for Addiction Disorders

Ages: All

Working with family, friends or employers, an Interventionist uses a team approach to confront an individual with pertinent facts regarding the impact of their addiction. Through an intervention, the individual is encouraged to seek treatment. If they agree to treatment, the Interventionist provides the individual with professional and confidential advice for addressing addiction-related issues, assistance with entering the most appropriate treatment program, as well as transportation to treatment and case coordination during and following completion of treatment. Grant funds may be available.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Project SELF (Students Experiencing Life Free)

Ages: 12-18

Project SELF is a research-based substance use disorder treatment program for youth. The grant funded outpatient treatment program lasts six months and consists of 12-14 weekly individual sessions in the home. Case management continuing care is also provided to assess individual need and offer links to other helpful resource services within the community as well as healthy activity options. Participants are tested to maintain substance abstinence during treatment.

Location: Davidson and Maury Counties

Project for Recovery, Encouragement and Empowerment

Outpatient Substance Abuse and Mental Health Treatment For individuals Under Supervision of the Criminal Justice System

Ages: 18 and older

Centerstone's Behavioral Health Services for Adults in the Criminal Justice System is a 16-17 week intensive program for individuals who suffer from drug and alcohol abuse and/or mental illness who are part of the criminal justice population living in the community. This includes individuals on probation, parole or pretrial release. Participants attend day and evening group therapy sessions 3-4 times per week. Treatment Services Include: screening and assessment, treatment planning, intensive outpatient treatment, case management, family and/or individual substance abuse education, relapse prevention, drug testing and monitoring and additional recovery support services.

Locations: Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Grundy, Lincoln, Moore and Warren Counties

Case Management Services

Case Management Services for Children and Youth

Ages: 17 and younger

Case Management is a voluntary in-home intervention and advocacy service. It is designed, whenever possible, to keep children and families together. The goal is to teach the child/families skills they need to be stronger and healthier, and to be able to advocate for the child's needs. Case Managers link, refer, advocate and skill build for families in the communities where they live.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Case Management Services for Adults

Ages: 18 and older

Case Management partners with the individual to assess needs, obtain services, treatments and support, and prevent and manage crisis. The focus is recovery and self-management. The individual and the case manager plan, coordinate, monitor, adjust and advocate for services and supports directed toward the achievement of the individual's goals for community living.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region



Kalico Kids

Ages: 6 and younger

A therapeutic case management program for preschool aged children who are survivors of physical, emotional and sexual abuse, and/or have aggressive and anti-social behaviors. The goal is to minimize anti-social behavior by helping children and their parents locate existing resources as well as teaching skills to parents, teachers and day care center workers.

Locations: Offered to residents of Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Lincoln and Moore Counties

Child and Family Services

Building Strong Families

Ages: 18 and younger

Building Strong Families is a grant funded program for children, birth to age 17, who are at imminent risk (within 24 hours) of being placed outside the home because of their parent's or caretaker's drug use. This program provides intensive family preservation services using the HOMEBUILDERS, evidence-based model. The program provides crisis intervention, intensive in-home therapy for all members of the family, parenting and life skills training and referral to other needed services, like substance abuse treatment. It is designed to keep children and families together.

Locations: Bedford, Cannon, Coffee, Franklin, Grundy, Lincoln, Moore, and Warren Counties

Early Childhood Network

Ages: Birth to 3rd grade and their families

Early Childhood Network is a grant funded program. Providers offer a myriad of intervention services to children (birth to 3rd grade) and their families where the child is having behavioral problems, and/or is currently diagnosed with an emotional or behavioral disorder which results in functional impairments and substantially interferes with family, school or community services.

Locations: Maury County (for Maury County Residents only)

Family Centered Services

(In-Home Counseling and Case Management)

Ages: 11-18

Family Centered Services are for adolescents in state custody due to severe behavioral problems. The goal of the program is to keep the family unified and return the child to their home and community as soon as possible (if placed in a residential program). In-home counseling and case management services are provided to help youth and family with transitioning.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region, Hamilton County Region, Southeast Region, Southwest Region

Adoption Program

The adoption program expedites adoptions for youth in Family Centered Services whose goal is to be adopted. This program matches prospective families within Family Centered Services with those youth who are ready to be adopted.

Therapeutic Foster Care

Therapeutic foster parents are trained to provide structure, guidance and nurturance for troubled children. Case managers are available to support children and foster parents 24/7. In-home therapists are also available as well as foster parent liaisons and team coordinators.

Mentoring Program

The Mentoring Program is for youth in need of support and adult role models in the foster care system. Adult mentors share personal time and participate in positive activities with youth on weekends. Mentors must be at least 21 years of age with full-coverage insurance and a driver's license.



Intensive In-Home Treatment

Ages: 3-17 years old and their families

Intensive In-Home Treatment provides high-intensity (4-6 hours/week), time-limited (60-90 days) therapeutic services for children and adolescents at imminent risk of out-of-home placement (acute psychiatric hospitalization, residential treatment, DCS custody) due to serious emotional illness which cannot be successfully treated in less intensive settings. Services are provided in the home and community and focus on short-term stabilization, with the ultimate goal being long-term stability for the member and family. In-home specialists are available 24/7 to respond to crises. In addition to the individual and family counseling component of the program, other services that may be provided include parenting training, behavior management, communication and relationship-building, self-management of moods and behavior and school interventions.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Mule Town Family Network

Ages: Birth to age 21

The Mule Town Family Network is a collaboration of Maury County child-serving agencies working in partnership to provide a coordinated system of care for children and youth with emotional disturbances and their families, who reside in Maury County. Led by the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities, Centerstone and Tennessee Voices for Children, the Network integrates and coordinates services to allow children with emotional disturbances to function more effectively at home, in school and within the community.

Location: Maury County Residents

Regional Intervention Program (RIP)

Ages: 6 and younger and their parents

RIP is a nationally recognized, parent-implemented program designed to help parents deal with the behavior and development of preschool children. Experienced parents, who completed the program, along with professional staff, successfully provide training and support for newly enrolled families. RIP is a grant funded program.

Locations: Maury and Montgomery Counties

Responsible Parenting Project

Ages: 12-21

The Responsible Parenting Project provides education and support for teenage parents of children age birth to four years. The grant funded course provides a supportive environment, classes during school hours, in-home visits and a 24-hour "Warm line."

Locations: Marshall and Maury Counties

Weems Academy

Ages: 6-22

Weems Academy is for youth who have emotional and behavioral problems that prevent them from functioning in a regular school setting. Public school coordinators refer students to Weems Academy where they receive counseling and therapy while maintaining their academic studies. The goal is to return the youth to their community school.

Location: Montgomery County

School-based Services

School-Based Counseling

Ages: 17 and younger

On-site counselors help students cope with problems. The program combines individual and group counseling with parent and teacher consultations. Priority is given to students in special education classes and severe or moderate behavioral intervention classes, or those at risk of entering those classes.

Locations: Select schools in Bedford, Cheatham, Davidson, Marshall, Maury, Montgomery, Stewart and Sumner



Coaching4Teens – Life Coaching for Teens

Ages: High School Students

Coaching4Teens offers personal coaching for high school students in the Nashville area. Coaching is a new concept sweeping the country. It started as a way to help business executives successfully manage their personal lives while balancing the demands of leading large organizations. Now coaching is available for teenagers who want to achieve success and balance, gain confidence, prioritize goals, sharpen decision-making skills and improve relationships. Mental Health Liaisons

Ages: High School Students

Mental Health Liaisons provides individual and group counseling services to high school students attending Metro Nashville Public Schools. Training for school personnel is also available. This program is funded by the State Department of Education and the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities.

Locations: Metro Davidson County High Schools

School-Based Counseling – Moderate Intervention Services (MIS)

Ages: Middle School Students in MIP

Counseling services are provided for students assigned to Metro Davidson County Middle School MIS classrooms. Counselors work with students individually or in groups, and assist school staff with maintaining/developing classroom behavior management programs. This service is funded through Metro Davidson County Public Schools.

Locations: Metro Davidson County Middle Schools

School-Based Prevention Programs

Be Sharp

Ages: 10-16

Be Sharp is a comprehensive substance abuse prevention program targeting youth who are at high risk for substance use/abuse in rural Middle Tennessee counties. Be Sharp utilizes an evidence-based curricula, along with service learning activities. Each 15 week group session is provided in community-based settings and focuses on enhancing individual knowledge, motivation and skills necessary to develop healthy communication skills, anti drug attitudes and avoidance of high-risk behaviors.

Locations: Dickson, Giles, Houston, Humphreys, Lawrence, Lincoln, Maury, Montgomery, Perry, Robertson, Stewart and Wayne counties.

PEER Power (Prevention Education Enhances Resiliency)

Ages: Fourth and Fifth Grade Students

As a school-based grant funded prevention program, PEER Power uses a research-based model of violence prevention. Staff train and partner with teachers to teach skills of empathy, impulse control, problem-solving and anger management.

Locations: Serving select schools in Davidson, Dickson, Houston, Maury and Montgomery Counties

Project BASIC (Better Attitudes and Skills In Children)

Ages: 5-8

Project BASIC is a school-based grant funded prevention program serving elementary school children (grades K-3). The program is designed to enhance students' interpersonal skills and identify emotionally disturbed children.

Locations: Serving select schools in Giles, Hickman, Lewis, Maury, Robertson and Wayne Counties



Project REAL (Get REAL, Get Tested!)

Ages: 12-17

Project REAL is a grant funded prevention program for youth ages 12-17 primarily of African American and Hispanic/Latino descent, at risk for substance abuse and HIV/AIDS. Comprehensive, culturally sensitive, evidence-based services are designed to prevent and reduce the onset of substance abuse and the transmission of HIV/AIDS. The project combines two evidence-based multi-cultural curricula, *Keepin' It REAL* and *Be Proud! Be Responsible!* Staff members facilitate curricula within local community centers, schools and other venues.

Locations: Cannon, Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Hickman, Macon, Robertson, Rutherford, Smith, Sumner, Trousdale, Williamson and Wilson

Project STAR (Standing Tall And Resilient)

Ages: 10-16

Project STAR is a school-based grant funded prevention program that serves middle and high school aged youth. The program, funded by the Tennessee Department of Health and the Metro Health Department, focuses on helping students and their families prevent the development of problem behaviors, such as substance use, violence, and premature sexual activity. Project STAR comprises three components: curriculum facilitation for youth in a small group setting, service learning activities and parent involvement.

Locations: Select schools in Dickson and Robertson Counties

Project MAP (Methamphetamine Awareness and Prevention)

Ages 10-18

Project MAP (Methamphetamine Awareness and Prevention) is a grant funded program to prevent, reduce, or delay the use and/or spread of meth abuse in high risk, rural Tennessee. The school-based prevention program serves middle and high school aged youth and is funded by the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities.

Locations: Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Giles, Grundy, Lincoln, Marshall, Maury, Moore and Warren counties

Court Services

Forensic Evaluation Services

Ages: All

Through Forensic Evaluation services, Centerstone performs competency and mental condition evaluations at the request of courts.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Mental Health Court Liaison

Ages: 18 and older

The Mental Health Court Liaison serves as a link between Centerstone clients and the Mental Health Court, providing information about the treatment progress of court appointed clients. The Liaison also accepts new referrals from the court for Centerstone services.

Location: Davidson County

Homeless Services

Homeless Liaison Services

Ages: Children 18 and under and their families or pregnant mothers

Homeless Liaison Services provide assistance for homeless children diagnosed as emotionally disturbed (or who are at-risk) and their families. The grant funded program provides outreach, service linkage and other related services for families who may be homeless, in a shelter or are at eminent risk of becoming homeless.

Location: Davidson County (for Davidson County Residents)



HOPE (Homeless Outreach Partnership and Empowerment)

Ages: 18 and older

Centerstone's HOPE program serves adults with substance use and/or mental health disorders who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless and who live in Clarksville, Tennessee (Montgomery County). Grant funded services are provided in the community using an Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) model, characterized by low staff to client ratio, flexible service delivery and comprehensive services including medication management, individual therapy, case management, psycho-educational groups, housing and employment assistance.

Location: Montgomery County (for Montgomery County Residents)

PATH - Homeless Services (Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness)

Ages: 18 and older

PATH is a grant funded program serving homeless people with severe and/or persistent mental illness who may have a co-occurring substance addiction. PATH assists individuals in obtaining the community services necessary to meet their physical and psychological needs in order to be re-integrated into the community.

Location: Montgomery County

Immigrant & Refugee Services

Specialized Treatment Services for Immigrants & Refugees

Ages: All

This program was created in response to the need for culturally appropriate mental health services. The program provides mental health outreach, education, and treatment benefiting culturally diverse individuals throughout Davidson County. These individuals hail from a variety of homelands and suffer post traumatic stress disorder, major depression, and other illnesses common among persons surviving unimaginable trauma — wars, violent deaths of friends and family members, detention camps, displacement.

Location: Davidson County

Residential Services

Adult Independent

Ages: 18 and older

DABBS, KINGVIEW, PEMBROOK, MARSHALL PLACE AND VIVIAN HOUSE

In Adult Independent facilities, adults are responsible for their activities of daily living with regular support through case management. No on-site staff.

Location: Davidson, Marshall and Montgomery Counties

Adult Long-term

Ages: 18 and older

RIDGEVIEW RESIDENTIAL

Long-term residential facilities offer daily training in self-sufficiency skills, symptom management, medication management and supervised recreational and socialization activities.

Location: Houston County

Adult Supported Housing

Ages: 18 and older

CEDAR WALK, COMMUNITY LIVING CENTER, HARBOR HOUSE, JACKSON HALL, OAK HILL, AND SEVEN SUBCONTRACTED HOMES

Adult supported housing services assist individuals in transition from psychiatric hospitalization or unstable living situation to stable and more independent living situations.

Locations: Coffee, Davidson, Dickson, Maury, Montgomery, and Wilson Counties



Housing Specialists

Ages: 18 and older

Housing specialists administer funding for independent living assistance and focus on determining housing needs of homeless or displaced individuals. Specialists also link individuals with suitable housing based on their needs.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Youth Group Homes

Ages: 11-18

These are highly structured programs addressing problems or behaviors keeping youth from being successful in the community. Residency lasts two to three months. While living in the home, youth attend public schools, participate in community recreation and learn independent living skills such as food preparation, banking, laundry and shopping.

Hart Lane

Hart lane is a 7-bed group home for boys ages 11-17.

Location: Davidson County

The Lodge

The Lodge is a 6-bed residential facility (Level II) for girls ages 11 to 18. The average stay is 1 to 3 months.

Services focus on rapid stabilization and quick transition back to home and community. Individuals are also linked to mental health treatment and other supports to help prevent the occurrence of a future crisis.

Location: Montgomery County

Respite Services

Planned Respite Care

Ages: 2-17

Planned Respite Care serves families with children diagnosed with developmental delay and serious emotional disturbance. Planned Respite Care helps families care for children in their home and locate and train appropriate respite caregivers.

Locations: Davidson County Residents

Respite Care for Youth

Ages: 12-18

Respite Care for Youth provides short-term crisis intervention and stabilization for youth in state custody or in non-custodial situations. Family therapy is included.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Respite Care for Adults

Ages: 18 and older

Respite Care for Adults offers supervised residential care (up to three days) for adults in crisis who need time away from their home environment, but do not require hospitalization.

Location: Middle Tennessee Region

Specialized Services

Continuous Treatment Team for Adults

Ages: 18 and older

The Continuous Treatment Team for Adults is a coordinated, multidisciplinary community-based team comprised of a MD, nurse and Case Manager providing intensive treatment, rehabilitation and support services to severely mentally ill adults.

Locations: Middle Tennessee Region



Hospital Liaison

Ages: All

Hospital Liaisons ensure individuals hospitalized at inpatient psychiatric facilities are offered services through Centerstone. For individuals already receiving Centerstone services, we ensure continuity of care between inpatient and outpatient services.

Locations: Offered to residents of Davidson County. Psychiatric hospitals in other counties may call for services.

Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)

Ages: 18 and older

Intensive Outpatient Program is intensive therapy in a group setting for adults experiencing acute psychiatric symptoms. The goal is to stabilize acute symptom, allowing the individual to remain in the community. Services are provided two hours a day, three days a week.

Locations: Davidson County. Call 615.460.4430 for information about availability in other counties.

ReConnect Centers

Ages: 18 and older

ReConnect Centers provide a safe and supportive environment where individuals gain confidence, build social skills, develop new friendships and engage in learning activities with peers. As a peer-operated program, members are involved in all aspects of ReConnect. Activities include: educational classes promoting independence, support groups, meals and dining out, arts and crafts, field trips, sporting events, shopping excursions, music, parties and dancing. ReConnect works in conjunction with Psychosocial Services and Employment Services.

Locations: Bedford, Coffee, Davidson, Dickson, Lawrence, Lincoln, Maury, Montgomery and Robertson Counties

Employment Services

Ages: 18 and older

Centerstone's Employment Services offer job counseling, job development and on-the-job support services for individuals entering the workforce. The program operates on the belief that active employment is important for recovery. Employment Services include: assessment, career planning, job readiness training, and placement, all in an effort to help individuals achieve career goals.

Locations: Offered to residents of Bedford, Cheatham, Coffee, Davidson, Dickson, Franklin, Humphreys, Lincoln, Maury, Marshall, Montgomery, Moore, Robertson, Stewart and Williamson Counties

Psychosocial Services

Ages: 18 and older

Psychosocial Services are person-centered recovery-based classes for adults. Class curriculum focuses on individual strengths, allowing each member to actively participate in recovery. Centerstone staff work closely with participants, helping them set educational, vocational and interpersonal goals.

Locations: Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Giles, Hickman, Houston, Humphreys, Lawrence, Lewis, Marshall, Maury, Montgomery, Stewart and Wayne

Partial Hospitalization Program

Ages: 18 and older

The Partial Hospitalization Program is a structured intensive therapeutic program for adults experiencing acute psychiatric symptoms. The program may serve as a transition program following inpatient treatment, or as an alternative to inpatient care, while providing the same intensity of care found in inpatient programs.
